What is an English Camp?

An English camp is an English language summer school course for children and teenagers aged 6-18 years old. The students are taught in the familiarity of their own school, allowing them to learn the English language with confidence and ease. Our teams are made up of enthusiastic, experienced, fun-loving English language teachers and activity leaders that work with classes of around 15 children on our courses. Most of the courses are in Italy, although we do also have courses in the Ukraine, Germany, Spain and France. On every camp we integrate English language lessons, art workshops, drama workshops and sports activities in a fun and exciting way, with the aim of increasing children's confidence to speak English.





This year's theme

In this year's theme, *Our Wonderful World*, students will learn English through adventure and discovery as they read and learn about different countries, their culture and the people that live in them. Every day has a daily theme, such as food or shopping, to provide a focus for the day and a framework to facilitate the students' learning. The students learn related vocabulary and grammar to enable them to communicate confidently in English, and the theme is brought alive through drama, art and sport activities that encourage the students to have fun learning. On the last day of the camp, there is usually a final performance for the family and friends of the students, which gives them an opportunity to show each other and their parents the exciting discoveries and adventures they have had on this year's English Camp and to demonstrate their increased confidence in and ability with the English language.





Working on an English Camp

Our courses typically run during the first or last two weeks of European school summer holidays. Most of our camps run for two weeks, although some are only one week long. Occasionally it is possible to work on two camps back to back, or at either end of the summer, however priority for this is given to our returning staff. This year the majority of the camps will be during the second half of June and early July and from late August to mid-September. The courses vary in size and location; some are in large cities, but many are in or near smaller towns.

We are looking for English language teachers and activity leaders to work during these periods on English Camps. For each staff member we provide travel to and from the camp from a London airport, full board host family accommodation and a competitive rate of pay. The experience is one that is not only enjoyable for the children but also for the staff, as they spend their time teaching English, art, drama and sport with a team of like-minded people who care about children's education.

As a staff member you are supported by a Camp Co-ordinator who is able to assist you whenever necessary and will provide you with guidance and advice on working on an English camp. You also gain the experience of staying with a host family where you learn more about the culture and customs of the country. As representatives of the company, we expect teachers and activity leaders to be professional at all times; not only during the school day, which typically runs from 8.30am to 4.30pm, but also while staying with their host family, and to respect the customs and culture of their hosts. When approached with enthusiasm and commitment, this is an experience from which staff members will gain a huge amount.
